




# Five Ways Primary School

Next week, we will be continuing to focus on fantasy stories in English. You should have already thought about your hero, villain, and fantasy setting. If you haven't, please spend some time thinking about these elements over the weekend. You will notice that this week, I have uploaded a homework task to Google Classroom. You will need to log in to Google Classroom to access the details for this homework task. I would love to see your pieces of homework so please send me some pictures on Google Classroom if you are able to. Our learning focus in English next week is using speech accurately in our writing. We will also be reading two more chapters of our class book, 'Alice in Wonderland.' In Maths next week, we will be moving on to a new topic, 'Multiplication and Division.' We will begin with how to use short multiplication as a written method for multiplying a 3/4-digit number by a 1-digit number. It is very important that we continue to practise our recall of times table facts for this topic. Over the weekend, please log on to [TTRockstars](#) and [Hit the Button](#) to practise those times table facts! You could even make up your own times table game to play with someone at home. Make learning your times tables as fun as you can! **Next week, our maths zooms will be changing slightly. I have decided to split you into two groups for your maths lesson as we move onto the multiplication and division topic. Group 1's lesson will take place at an earlier time of 10.30am. Group 2's lesson will continue to take place at 11am. Groupings will have been discussed in Friday's zoom call. If you did not attend this call, you can find out which group you are in by accessing the 'Classwork' tab on Google Classroom and clicking 'Zoom Groups' at the top of the page. Please make sure you are all aware of your updated Zoom time before Monday. As always, the PIN and password will still remain the same as before. The overview for our learning for the week commencing 25<sup>th</sup> January is attached to the end of this letter. From next week, Mrs Berry may also be joining some of our Zoom lessons and may even begin some smaller zoom groups in an afternoon. More details of this and who it will involve will follow.**

Next week, your wider curriculum learning will also be changing slightly. You will notice on Monday morning that all of your wider curriculum learning for the whole week has been uploaded. You **do not** have to complete every task on Monday. You can spread your learning out over the course of the week as you normally would. 
