Dear Year 2 children and parents,

I am feeling really excited this week because I will be able to see you all and chat to you all during our Zoom meetings. Your grown-up will have received an email to invite you a meeting in the forthcoming week. I am really looking forward to seeing you and hearing about the exciting activities you have been doing at home. I know everyone will be really patient in this week's meetings as we all get used to using our devices for Zoom calls and we get used to communicating with each other in this new way. Please be ready to listen to my instructions and to listen to each child as you all take turns. If for any reason the technology lets us down and the meeting closes sooner than expected, your grown-up will receive an email informing them when the next meeting will be held.

This week's letter includes options for your home learning in maths, reading, spelling and writing, and also some projects to choose from.

Our advice for your week's home learning is to complete up to one bullet point from each section, if possible, per day. If you are able to spend between one to three hours, per day, on your home learning, that is great. Most Year Two children would benefit from doing a daily phonics or spellings session of 15 to 20 minutes, a daily reading session of between 15 to 30 minutes including discussion, a daily maths session of between 20 to 40 minutes, a daily writing session of between 10 minutes to 30 minutes depending on the task, and an active PE session. Remember to take a break between each session of learning.

Just a reminder that you are not being asked to do all of the activities, you are being provided with suggestions to choose from. Please refer to the resources on the website to help you navigate this week's learning.

Strategies you may wish to use to help you to learn your spellings:

- Look, say, cover, write, check
- Quickwrite, Pyramid, Squiggle

Extension challenges for confident spellers:

- revise your knowledge of suffixes by making a list of words ending in the suffix 's'.
- establish some rules for adding 's' or 'es', e.g. *jump-jumps* wash washes ride-rides
 - Challenge: Use your 's' word in a verbal or written sentence.

Weekly Writing

Children who need more support:

 practise your letter and number formation

All children: link to Science

- Look at the 'Images of Mini-beasts' sheet – How many can you name? What body parts do the mini-beasts have, e.g. pincers, wings?
- Design your own brand new mini-beast

 draw it and colour it in. Annotate
 your drawing with noun phrases, e.g.
 long, pink antennae. You could also
 build your mini-beast using play dough,
 pipe cleaners, googly eyes and feathers.
- Write a (pretend) letter to Steve Backshall of Deadly 60 – tell him all about your mini-beast, its appearance, how it moves, what it sounds like, habitat, its food, its life cycle.
- choose a BBC Bitesize or Oak National Academy English challenge

Extension challenges for confident writers:

Extend your Science challenge (see below) by writing an exciting report for children, with sections about a few mini-beasts, instead of just one. Perhaps you can give the whole report a fun title. Each section could have a subheading (perhaps a question to get the reader thinking or an exclamation to make it sound exciting and dramatic). You could label your pictures so the reader understands what they are looking at.

Daily Mathematics (pick one per day)

 use the 'maths toolkits' that were sent home to continue to practise recognising and adding different coins (eg 10p + 20p =)
