We are continuing to focus on fantasy stories in English. If you haven't thought about it yet - now is the time! Spend a little bit of time thinking about and then jotting down your rough ideas for your story. (Don't worry - this can be changed as we go). In preparation for our learning this week you could jot down a list of villains and sidekicks in the fantasy stories that you know. This week we will be exploring Alice in Wonderland by Lewis Carroll. This unit is an excellent opportunity to read one of the 'classics' independently or together with your adult. You may also decide to watch some of the film versions and to compare them to the original written version. Also remember to keep track of your reading in your home-link books. Mrs Berry will be keen to hear the next stages of teddy parts that need to be given out on our return to school!

Last week in Maths you amazed me with how well you did with multiplying by 1 digit using the short formal written method. This week, we will be moving onto multiplying by 2 digit numbers. It is very important that you keep practising quick recall of your times table facts to help you when you are multiplying and dividing larger number using written methods. Continue to play times table games — can you create your own times table game to play with your family? Remember to login to TTRockstars — will you be one of this weeks Rockstar Superstars?! Announcements will be made on Monday morning.

RSPB Great British Bird Watch 29th- 31st January

Join the RSPB for the Big Garden Birdwatch and discover the drama on your doorstep. The great thing is that you never know what birds you might see. Will you enjoy a flock of fluffed-up long-tailed tits, will you be charmed by a group of goldfinches or will a cheeky robin steal the show?

Please note, there will be a live lesson from BBC based on the Great British Bird Watch at 11am on the 28th January. Although you will not be able to watch live as we will be having our maths lesson, I have uploaded the link for you to watch another time. There is also an activity sheet to go alongside this lesson. Please see Google Classroom for lots of different activities for you to have a go at, including some links to some fun websites. This is a project so can run over the week.

As this week is the RSPB Great British Bird Watch, why don't you encourage birds into your garden and help them by feeding them over the winter months. Watch this <u>video</u> then challenge yourself to make your own bird feeder using recycling materials. You could upload a picture of your bird feeder by clicking the 'add' button and uploading a picture from your drive.

Science – New Topic – The Heart and Circulation

Lesson 1 - What happens to the circulatory system during exercise? (thenational.academy)

Watch and interact with the lesson which will teach you about the parts of the human circulatory system.

Learn how to locate and take your resting heart rate. If you have a fitness app or smart watch you could use this but do learn to locate the pulse on your wrist. The movement you feel is the blood pumping through your blood vessels!

- Measure your heart rate at rest and after exercise as shown in the film clip.
- What other changes can you observe in your body as you exercise?
- You could try different types/intensities of exercise to see the impact this has on your heart rate.

Challenge: Find out how long it takes for your pulse rate to return to normal following exercise.
