Developing Remove the conjunction from the simple sentence and write the two sentences which were joined together.

Expected Remove the conjunction from the sentence and write the two sentences which were joined together.

Greater Depth Remove the conjunction from the sentence and write the three sentences which were joined together. Includes two conjunctions per sentence.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain which simple sentence has used a conjunction incorrectly.

Expected Explain which sentence has used a conjunction incorrectly.

Greater Depth Explain which sentence has used a conjunction incorrectly. Includes two conjunctions per sentence and a maximum of 3 clauses.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application)

Developing Arrange 6 cards to create a simple sentence and add a conjunction.

Expected Arrange 9 cards to create a sentence and add a conjunction.

Greater Depth Arrange 12 cards to create a sentence with a maximum of three clauses and add two conjunctions.

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Developing

- 1a. I walked inside. I went up the stairs.
- 2a. Seth. He left both items at the park so he should have used 'and'.
- 3a. Various answers, for example: he likes crisps but I love cake.

Expected

- 4a. Ali wanted to drive to work. He could not find his car keys.
- 5a. Oscar. 'Or' is used to show choices; he should have used 'so' because they went to the beach because it was a hot day.
- 6a. Various answers, for example: my friend was sad so I gave her a hug.

Greater Depth

- 7a. I have no milk left. I need to buy some more. The shops are closed.
- 8a. Liam. He wore his coat because of the rain so he should have used 'so'.
- 9a. Various answers, for example: I don't have a cat or a dog but I do have a hamster.

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Developing

- 1b. I love cats. I am scared of dogs.
- 2b. Sally. She is unable to go without a ticket so she should have used 'but'.
- 3b. Various answers, for example: we can have some beans or peas.

Expected

- 4b. Sarah could wait for a taxi. She could get the bus home instead.
- 5b. Beth. She needs both items to make a sandwich so she should have used 'and'.
- 6b. Tia lost her pet dog but he came back home.

Greater Depth

- 7b. We can have chips [for lunch]. We can have wedges for lunch. I would prefer mash.
- 8b. Lily. The bags were both big and heavy so she should have used 'and'.
- 9b. Various answers; for example: my dad said I can have cake or sweets but I can't have both.
