- Task 2 Writing expanded noun phrases: write phrases to describe the setting remember you can add description before and after the noun, e.g. The long-forgotten castle which had three turrets...
- Task 3 Writing Task Write your description of the abandoned place. Try to use simile and metaphors.
- Task 4 Proof-read your description and check it carefully against the success criteria.
 Can you make any improvements?
- Task 5 Complete the grammar activity on the Home Learning page.
