P4/5

a) Where were Odysseus and his men going?

Home after a long war.

b) Which phrase tells you that Odysseus was worried?

"I fear," said Odysseus

c) Find and copy two pieces of information about the hills.

They were towering hills, dotted with huge caves.

d) Why did they decide not to get back on their boat and leave straightaway?

Odysseus wanted to see what the Cyclopes were like.

e) On page 6, the men do not want to climb the hill. How do you know?

They wanted to leave straight away by saying "Let's go!".

f) Why did the men think something big was coming?

They were in a giant cave, they could see huge logs and the footsteps must have been very loud.
