Personal, Social and Emotiona l Developm ent:

Managin g Feelings and Behaviou r

Children talk about how they and <mark>others show</mark> feelings, talk about their own and others' behaviour, and its consequences, and know that some behaviour is unacceptable. They work as part of a group or class, and understand and follow the rules. They adjust their behaviour to different situations, and take changes <mark>of routine in their</mark> stride.

Discuss all of the changes that have happened these last few months. Talk about how you all feel?

Talk about what they are looking forward to when they return to school. What might they be nervous about?

Discuss that everyone gets nervous and scared, even grow-ups and that it is perfectly okay.

Talk about how they are a year older and will have a new year group and teacher. What are they excited about? Do they have any questions to ask?

Read/Listen to the story 'Be Brave Little Penguin'

Talk about how the penguin was scared to go in the water and how he overcome this. Talk about things you may be scared of? Is there a time when you have had to be brave?

Communi cation and Language:

Speaking

Children express themselves effectively, showing awareness of listeners' needs. They use past, present and future forms accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future. They develop their own narratives and explanations by

Talk about your own experiences of family holidays.

Where did you go? How did you get there? Who did you go with?

Look at photographs and talk about the great memories that you had.

Ask your family members if they have been to different places on holiday.

# connecting ideas or events.

Bubble blowing is a good activity to target oral motor or mouth skills. Blowing exercises increase strength in the tongue for producing the sounds at the back of our mouth like consonants K and G. It's also good for working on lip rounding which is necessary for the consonant sound W and the vowels 'oo' and 'oh.

# Physical developm ent: Moving and Handling

Children show good control and coordination in large and small movements. They move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space. They handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing.

Children know the importance for good health of physical exercise, and a healthy diet, and talk about ways to keep healthy and safe. They manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs successfully, including dressing and going to the toilet independently.

Now the weather is nice, do lots of physical activities outside.

- ~ Skipping

Talk about the importance of staying safe in the sun. Why do we need to wear a sun hat and sun cream?

Talk about keeping safe near the water. Make a poster/list of rules about water safety. For example:

Always stay by a grown up. Do not run by water.

Always stay in arms reach.

See what water safety rules you can come up with.

Make sure you can get dressed and undressed by yourself ready for Year One.

# **Literacy:** Writing

Children use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. They also write <mark>some irregular</mark> common words. They write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Some words are spelt correctly and others are <u>phonetically</u> plausible.

Reading

Children read and understand simple sentences. They use phonic knowledge to <mark>decode regular</mark> words and read them aloud accurately. They also read some common irregular words. They demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they <mark>have read.</mark>



# Mathem atics: Number

Children count reliably with numbers from one to 20, place them in order and say which number is <mark>one more or one</mark> less than a given number. Using quantities and objects, they add and subtract two single-digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer. They solve problems, including doubling, halving and <mark>sharing.</mark>

Create your own boats with bottle caps and paper. Write numbers on your boats. Can you put them in the correct order? Which one will sail away the fastest?



#### Shape, space and Measure

Children use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects and to <mark>solve problems</mark>. They recognise, create and describe patterns. They explore characteristics of everyday objects and shapes and use mathematical language to describe them.

In your ice cream shop, use real money to buy and pay for your ice creams.

Label each flavour with a price.

For example, Ip, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p.

Challenge - use 2ps to count in twos,


5p for fives and 10p

Have a ball race. Roll a ball and see how far it travels. Draw a line or mark the spot where it stopped. See if you can make it go further.

Create a repeated pattern with summer objects. You could also draw out your repeated pattern. For example,

Shell, spade, bucket, shell, spade, bucket.

Can you find any pinecones outside or shells/pebbles? Share them out between you and your family. How many do you have each?

Underst anding the World: Technol ogy Children recognise that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools. They select and use technology for particular purposes.

Winter and summer themed clothes - sort out different items of clothing that you would wear in the summer and in the winter. Discuss why you would need it, linking it to the weather.

Children talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members.

Discuss the changes that happen in the summer.

### Underst anding the World

They talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another. They make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.

compare them all.

Compare photographs of the seaside with where we live. Talk about the similarities and differences that you can see. You could paint or draw a picture of the seaside and one of where you live. What animals/creatures might you find at the seaside but not in a city?

Google Earth is great for looking at comparisons and what you can see from a satellite view.

Talk about your own experiences of family holidays. Where did you go? Can you find the place on a map? How long did it take to get there? How did you get there?

Talk about ice lollies and ice cream and the process of melting. Leave one in the sun and experiment with what happens. What would happen if you froze water in the freezer?

Make your own ice lollies using squash and water! What flavours could you make?
