During our last few days in Nursery we will be dressing up as Nursery Rhyme characters and performing in our Summer Show. We also have an inflatable and sensory session to look forward to.


# Reception News


Reception enjoyed a visit to Ash End Farm after learning all about farm animals and their young. We saw lots of different animals including a horse, foal, pig, piglet,

On Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, Year 5 had a visit from the Midlands Air Ambulance Charity. As the charity is not Government funded and relies on donations, Year 5 wore items of red and brought in a small monetary donation - we raised a fantastic £135!

During the day, the children learnt about the charity and the work that they do. Part of the day was spent visiting an air ambulance pod. The children had the opportunity to see what it was like inside the air ambulance helicopter. They were surprised to discover the amount of equipment within the pod and also that the air ambulance paramedics were able to perform open heart surgery on the side of the road if needed.

Year 5 were also taught how to carry out CPR and practised on a blown-up dummy called Geoff! They soon realised how tiring it was and how important it is to know the process and what to do in an emergency. Alongside this, they were also shown how to put someone in the recovery position.

The children wrote some lovely poems about the air ambulance and the work they do.
