Art

- Can you make your own play dough? There are some great and simple recipes online using flour, salt and water. Can you use your play dough to make some of the animals we saw in the story Paddington at the Zoo? Can you make your numbers to 100 or even some of our phonic families out of the play dough?
- make Easter decorations (including your Easter bonnet) to go around your house.
- Make a junk model - collect cereal boxes and tubs. You could make a space rocket, vehicle or monster.
- Create a sock puppet or finger puppet. Could your puppet tell your grown up or sibling a story?
- Make your own sculpture using Lego or play dough
- Make a bird feeder.
- Build yourself a boat and see if you can make it float!

- Complete a 5 minute move kids work out with Joe Wicks.
- Perform a gymnastics or dance routine. Perhaps an adult can film you. If you save it on a memory stick, our class could watch it together.
