Curriculum Coverage

Mathematics

- Read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10 000 000 and determine the value of each
- Identify the value of each digit in numbers given to three decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 giving answers up to three decimal places.
- Multiply and divide numbers with up to 4 digits using a formal written method.
- Develop reasoning skills by asking mathematical guestions, e.g. Is there a pattern?

- Use dictionaries to check the spelling and meaning of words.

To support your child at home:

- Encourage your child to read and discuss the texts with you at least three times each week. Refer to the Year 6 'Reading Mission' cards to motivate them.
- Use 'Bug Club' online reading resources to find a broader selection of texts.

Physical Education

- Develop gymnastics sequences







It is really important to chat with your children on an ongoing basis about staying safe online. Not sure where to begin? These conversation starter suggestions can help.




Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online.



Open Evenings: last week of September/ first week in October.


