



Thursday - English Writing:

To write a book review/information page about The Nowhere Emporium. You need to think of an overall title for your page. Then decide on 3-4 subheadings or sections you want to write about. Possible subheadings could be:

Try to include 2-3 relative clauses. Remember to punctuate them with brackets, dashes or commas.

Think of the overall presentation of your page. You can include pictures from the internet or illustrations of your own. Keep them safe as I would like to put some of them on display once we are back at school. Here is the start of mine with some tips for my chosen subheadings:

Ross was born in Glasgow, and has been fascinated by the magic of stories for as long as he can remember. He scribbled his first "book" – an illustrated story about a hungry crocodile called Colin – in a smuggled school jotter when he was seven.

Ross studied graphic design at college, moving on to work as a page designer for a national newspaper. He continued to write in secret, until his first book was published in September 2010. Ross lives near Glasgow with his wife, daughters, and their cocker spaniel. He spends much of his spare time in another world.

Where did your inspiration for The Nowhere Emporium come from?

It's a bit mysterious, actually! The Emporium sort of popped into my head fully formed. I could see this strange old shop so clearly in my head, the sparkling black brick and the faded sign. I knew the shop never stayed in one place for very long, and of course I had to find out why, so I wrote the story.

What is your favourite room in the Nowhere Emporium?

Actually, my favourite place in the entire Emporium is the shop-front where Daniel first meets Mr Silver. It's dim and dusty and mysterious, filled with so many treasures and curiosities. I could spend days looking around!

What would you write in the Book of Wonders?

I'd have a library with every story ever written waiting on the shelves for me. But it would be a library with a twist: I'd be able to meet the characters from my favourite books face to face! Actually, on second thought, this might turn out to be dangerous - the bad guys would probably try to escape and take over the word!
