




THEORY OF CHANGE



The Multiplication Tables Check

Do you have a child in year 4 at primary school?

If so, your child will be participating in the multiplication tables check (MTC) in June.

The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help your child's school to identify if your child may need additional support.

What is the multiplication tables check?

It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.

What if my child cannot access the check?

There are several access arrangements available for the check, which can be used to support pupils with specific needs. Your child's teacher will ensure that the access arrangements are appropriate for your child before they take the check in June.

Will I receive feedback on my child's check?

Yes. Your child's teacher will share your child's score with you. There is no pass mark for the check.

Where will the check be administered?

- in our classrooms or office spaces with the class teacher
- seating arrangements will allow all children to work quietly and independently
- adult: pupil ratios will ensure all children have access to any support they may need



Devices and input methods

- schools are encouraged to use the 'try it out' method to establish which input method is best suited for each pupil, based on knowledge of individual needs
- desktops, laptops, tablets Chromebooks or tablets
- keyboard, touchscreen or mouse keyboard or touchscreen
- based on normal classroom practice
- all children will be familiar with their device and input method ahead of the checks the 'try it out' check (actual check format) will be used with all pupils from April 2026

Individual access arrangements can include ...

- changing the colour contrast (black on white to blue on cream, black on blue/peach etc)
- increased or decreased font size
- change the standard 3 second pause between questions to use of 'Next' button 30 minute limit remains
- audio version to support visual or processing needs reads all instructions and questions
- audible timer alert to support visual needs
- input assistant answers dictated by pupil, entered by adult
- can have multiple access arrangements
- can practice using access arrangements on the 'try it out' check before the official MTC
