

Year 4 Curriculum Overview

2024-25 Spring 1

English

In English, we are studying Greek myths. We shall be reading a range of Greek myths, recognising themes in texts read, such as the triumph of good over evil or the use of magical devices. We will draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence. We will be writing our own Greek myth. We will use expanded noun phrases to give detailed character descriptions (e.g. 'the monster' expanded to 'the ugly monster with snakes for hair'.) You could help your child at home by sharing and discussing Greek myths, both in books and in film.

Maths

In maths, we are studying multiplication and division. We shall be using formal methods to multiply and divide 3-digit and 4-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers. We will be solving number and reasoning problems that involve multiplication and division. You could help your child at home by practising their instant recall of multiplication facts up to 12×12 .

Music

In music, we will be exploring musical structure through instrumental and rap music, in order to develop our understanding of dynamics and texture. You could help your child at home by practising their recorder if they have one.

Design and Technology

In D&T, we will be using mechanical systems to design and produce a toy using pneumatics. You could help your child at home by finding out about real-life examples of objects that operate using pneumatics.

Science

In science, we will be investigating sound. We will identify how sounds are made, associating them with something vibrating. We will be looking at how we hear, recognising that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear. You could help your child at home by discussing different sounds around the home and how sounds can be louder and quieter depending on how far you are away from the source of the sound.

Art

In art lessons, we are learning about colour. We will be using different media and improving our blending skills, incorporating this into a piece of artwork. You could help your child at home by looking at artwork, either in books, on line or in art galleries/museums, and discussing colours used.

Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)

In French, we will be learning the French words for different types of pets in order to have conversations about the pets we have and do not have. You could help your child at home by accessing the 'Language Angels' website.

Computing

In computing lessons, we will be developing our understanding of how audio recordings can be changed and edited. We will be considering the impact that editing audio can have, and evaluating the effectiveness of our choices.

History

In History, we will be studying the Ancient Greeks, and investigating Greek life and achievements. We will be recognising the legacy of Greek culture (art, architecture or literature) on later periods in British history, including the present day. You could help your child at home by finding out facts about Ancient Greece.

Physical Education (PE)

In PE, we are taking part in net/wall games and continuing to take part in gymnastics. In games, we will be developing our skills in order to play a game of badminton. In gymnastics, we will be developing our flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance. You could help your child at home by encouraging them to complete the Government's recommended sixty minutes of exercise per day.

Religious Education (RE)

In RE, we will be investigating Lent. We will be identifying how people prepare for special events, and how Christians prepare for Lent. You could help your child at home by talking about how you prepare for special events in your family, e.g. weddings, going on holiday.

Health and Relationships Education (HRE)

We will be continuing to study HRE at assembly times, as part of particular lessons and on designated days/weeks such as Safer Internet Day. We will also be taking part in a maths sponsor event and a maths enrichment day. You could help your child at home by looking at our British Values, and discussing their importance. The British Values can be found at the back of your child's Home Link book.
