

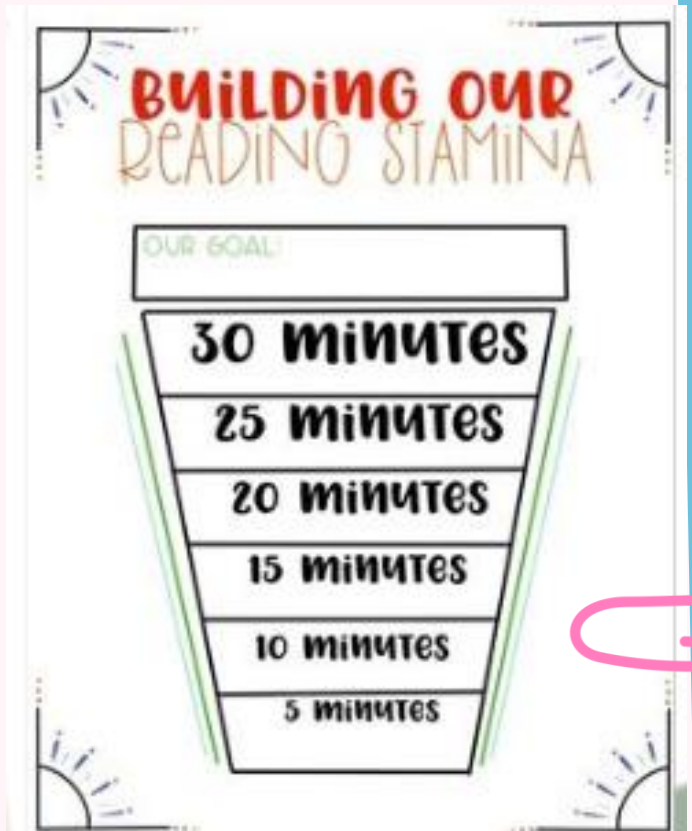

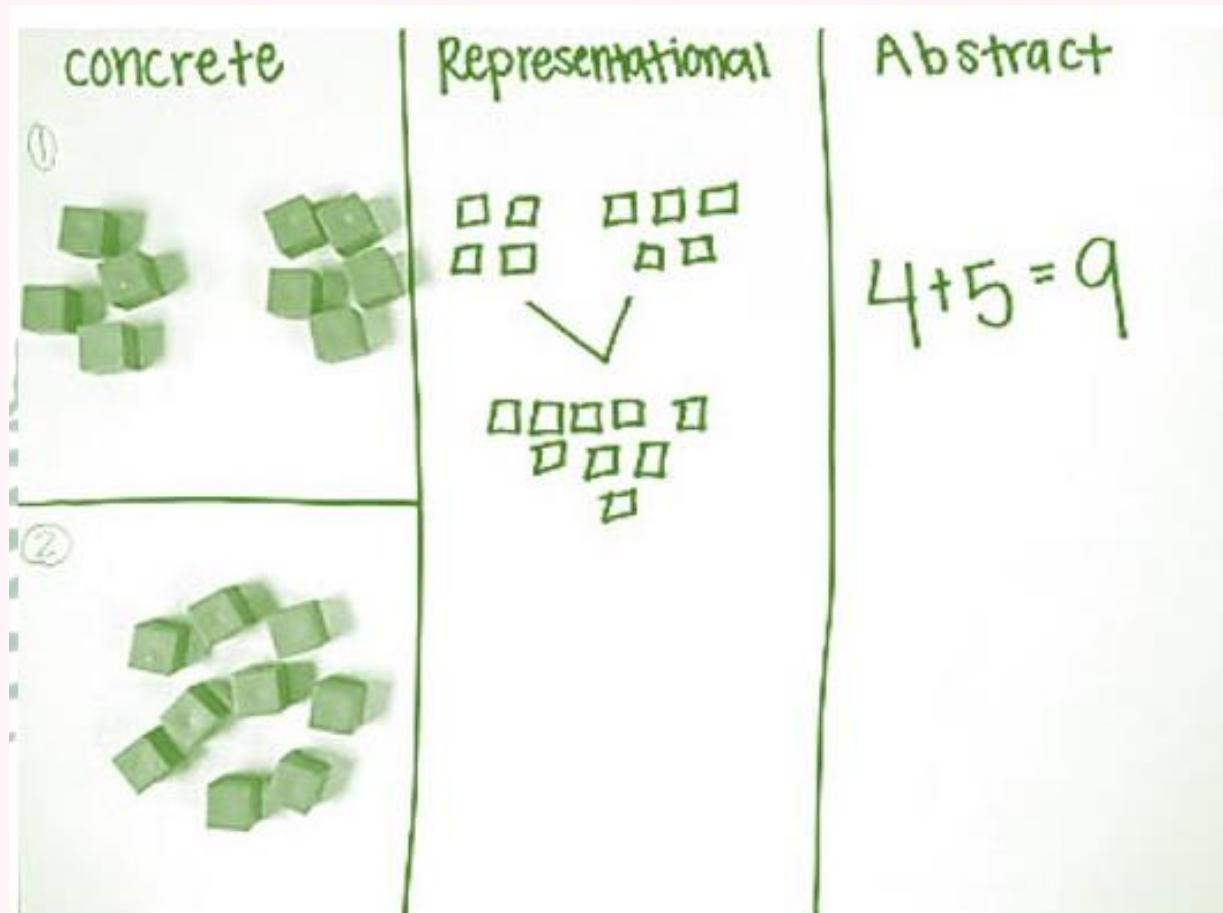

It is really important to chat with your children on an ongoing basis about staying safe online. Not sure where to begin? These conversation starter suggestions can help.



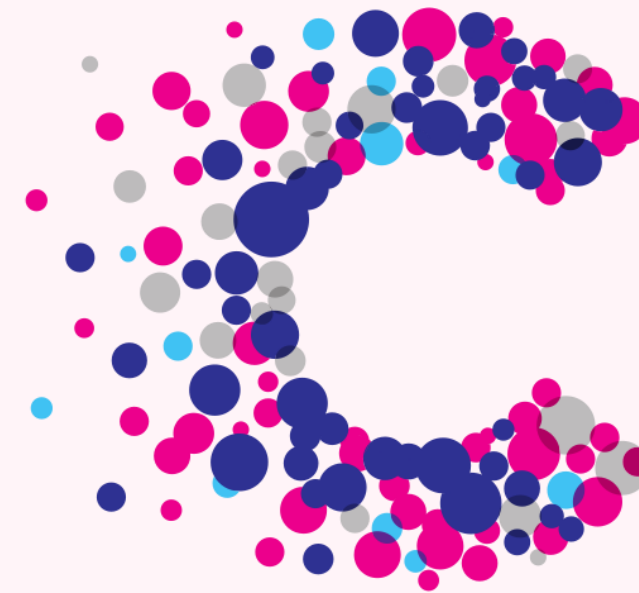
- **Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online.**

What tips do they have for you, and where did they learn them? What is OK and not OK to share?

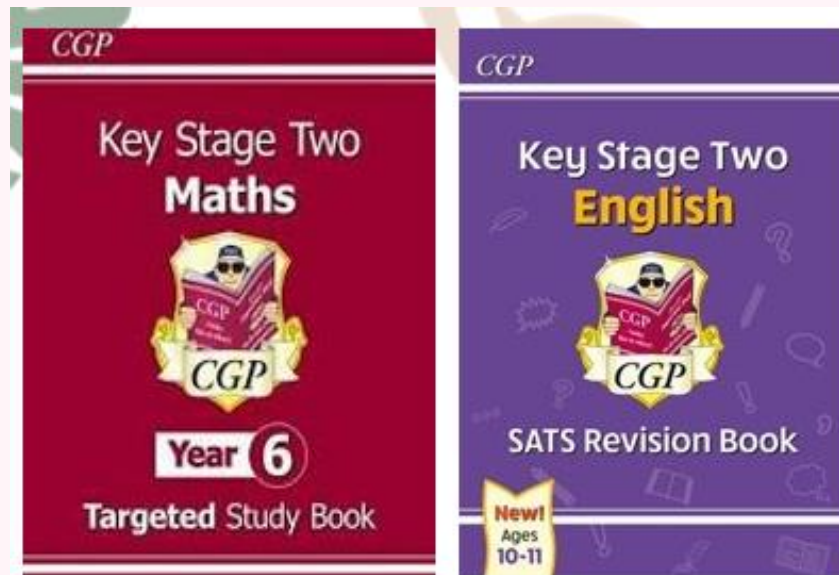

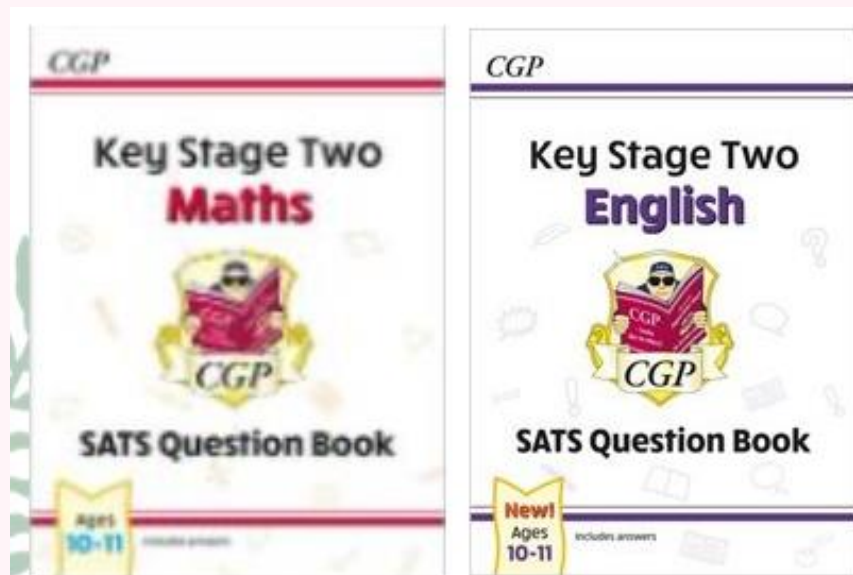

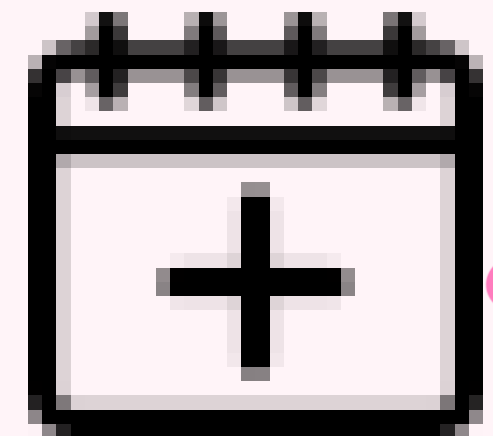
Self-marked alongside the teacher- this has a greater impact upon learning and helps identify common misconceptions to inform personalised next steps for learning.

SATs results and teacher assessments will be reported to you once school has received the results at the beginning of July.

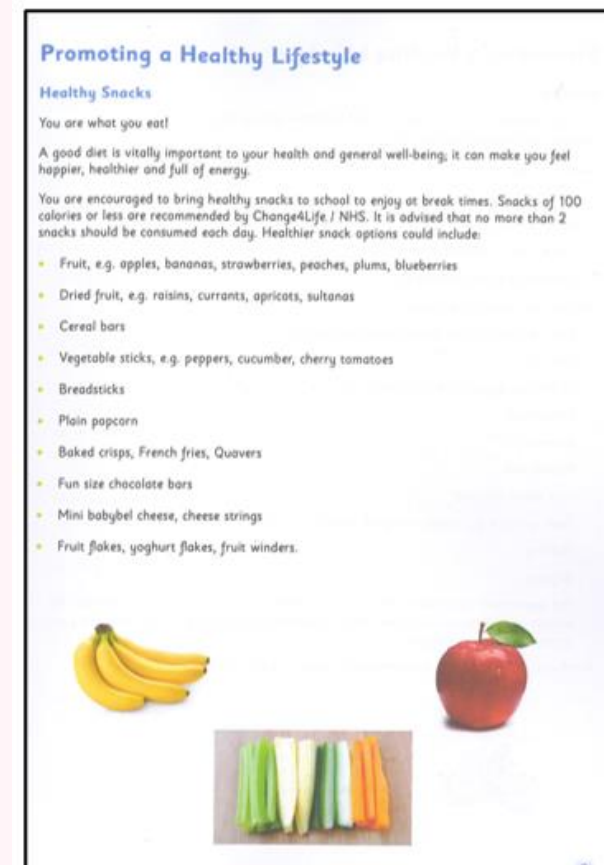
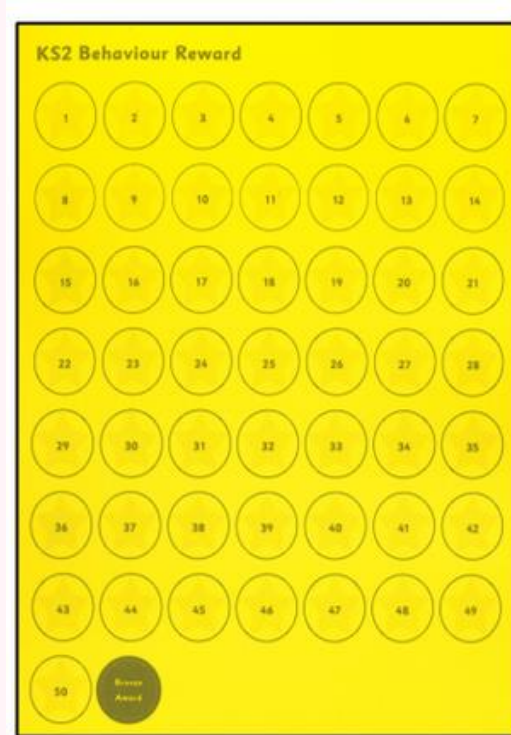
