## Progressive Sports Clubs - 2nd Half of Autumn Term 2018

Following half term, we will be operating the same booking system as before for clubs delivered by Progressive Sports. On Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> November, at approximately 4.00pm, the clubs relevant to your child's year group will appear on ParentPay; this will enable you to book and pay directly with Progressive Sports. Please note that there will still be a limit to the number of places available and once you have made your payment through your ParentPay account, your child's place will be secured. Once all places have been allocated, you will no longer be able to access the relevant area on ParentPay to book your child a place. An information sheet has been sent home today listing the sports clubs being delivered. *Please contact the school office if you experience any problems when trying to book your child a place. **Head Lice** Head lice are very common in young children. They do not have anything to do with dirty hair and are usually picked up from head-to-head contact. However, as a school we would like to prevent the spread of head lice, due to the impact the condition has upon everyone involved. Head lice can be treated without seeing a GP however; they do need treating as soon as they are spotted.
