### Aims of Mission Survive and Thrive

These Mission, Survive & Thrive days aim to offer fun and challenging activities that will see pupils enter into teams where they will work through tasks both physical and mental to see how they perform under pressure.

Specialist instructors will be on hand to give advice and offer encouragement where needed. Skills taught will ensure that your child learns how to survive and thrive in times of adversity: rising to any challenge that comes their way.

Over the two day course, pupils will have the opportunity to develop a wide range of interpersonal skills including: **Communication | Collaboration | Co-operation | Resilience | Determination | Decision Making | Perseverance | Problem Solving.**

### Clothing / Year 6 Leavers Hoodies

On the two days that your child is taking part in their activities, they can come to school in non-uniform however, we ask that clothing is practical for outdoor conditions and that a suitable weather proof coat is provided. We do request that denim jeans are not worn as part of their non-uniform, as they become very uncomfortable to wear once wet. Instead, we recommend comfortable jogging bottoms or trousers/leggings. For those wishing to wear their Leavers' T-shirts or Hoodies, then they can do so on their activity days however, please be mindful that they may come home slightly weathered and dirty. Non-uniform is only for the two-days that your child is taking part in the Mission Survive and Thrive activities. These Leavers' T-shirts and Hoodies may also be worn on the last day of school, at the end of this academic year.

### Packed Lunches

We recommend that on your child's Mission Survive and Thrive day, they bring to school with them a water bottle, a healthy snack for the start and end of the day and a packed lunch to



enjoy as a lunchtime picnic. For those pupils entitled to a free school meal, a picnic lunch will be made available, unless you would prefer for your child to bring their own from home. This can be ordered during our usual registration time, at the start of each day.

## Payment

Thank you to all parents who have already made payment for this two-day activity. Payments for this school-based adventure can still be made via your ParentPay account, as a **one-off payment of £37** or over **two instalments of £18.50 each**. Please be aware that no child will be excluded from this experience on the basis of genuine hardship therefore, if you have any concerns regarding the cost please make an appointment to speak to our School Business Manager, Mrs Russell, who can be contacted by telephone via the school office. Any information provided will be dealt with in the strictest of confidence.
