<u>Attendance and Raising Little Heroes</u> Regularly being absent from school can lead to a significant loss of learning opportunities, potentially putting your child at a disadvantage later in life. If your child has 95% attendance, which means 9 days off school, it can significantly affect

their performance, making it unlikely they will meet the expected standards in reading, writing, and maths. If your child has 90% attendance, missing 19 days of school, this can cause your child's academic performance to drop by up to 50%.
