

Pupils from Year 1 to Year 6 are asked to come to school in their PE kits on 24<sup>th</sup> September, as they will be taking part in additional physical activities that will promote healthy lifestyles. Nursery and Reception pupils will take part in additional activities as well however, they will not require their PE kit.

<u>Childhood Flu Vaccination Programme</u> I am pleased to inform you that as in previous years, pupils from Reception to Year 6 are eligible to receive their free NHS Nasal Spray Flu Vaccination at school on <u>Thursday 25th September</u>. The School Age Immunisation Team will be using a paperless, e-consent form, which is quick and easy to use, and can be completed on any electronic device. Please click on this link:

https://forms.mpft.nhs.uk/?session=6261&code=SS124070-25 to complete the e-consent form. The code required for our school is **SS124070-25**. Parents are asked to complete the form by **10.00am on Tuesday 23rd September 2025 at the latest**. Please be aware that even if your child received the vaccine last year, it is recommended strongly that they have it again this year.

Parents are asked to complete and submit your child's consent form promptly, whether you wish your child to be immunised or not; please only submit one consent form per child. If you have any concerns or would like to discuss any matters further, please do not hesitate to contact a member of the NHS Immunisation Team on 0300 124 0366 (Monday to Friday 8.30am – 12.30pm).

For further information, please see the letter sent home this week. If you have any further questions or need more information, parents are asked to ring the NHS Team rather than contacting the school office, as the NHS Team are specialists within this area.

Important Reminder: Five Ways is a NUT-FREE School

Please be reminded that Five Ways
Primary School is a strictly nut-free environment. This policy is in place to protect several of
our pupils who live with severe nut allergies, which can lead to life-threatening reactions,
including anaphylaxis. To ensure the safety of all children, NO nut-based products are
permitted on school grounds. This includes any food items that contain nuts or may contain
traces of nuts. Allergic reactions can occur not only through eating but also through inhalation or
skin contact, making vigilance essential. We kindly ask that you check all food labels
carefully before packing your child's lunch or snacks. If a product states "may contain
nuts" or "produced in a facility that handles nuts," please DO NOT send it into school.

Examples of items that must be avoided include: chocolate spreads (e.g. Nutella), cereal bars, biscuits and cakes containing nuts, certain sauces and condiments.

If a member of staff identifies a pupil with a nut-containing item, it will be **politely removed**, and the reason will be explained to the child. This is not a disciplinary action but a necessary precaution to protect others. Please ensure that **NO nut products or items that may contain traces of nuts** are included in your child's lunchbox or brought into school as snacks (for Key Stage 2 pupils). Thank you for your continued support and cooperation in keeping our school community safe.

Changes to the Law for taking Leave of Absence during Term Time
This is an important reminder that the Department of Education made important changes to the law for families wanting to request leave of absence in term time. The changes made it clear that <a href="Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.">Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.</a>
The Local Authority and our school governors support this; therefore, children will only be given permission to take leave in term time if there are exceptional circumstances. Please be aware that Staffordshire County Council state that exceptional circumstances no longer include, family weddings or Special Educational Needs of pupils or family members.

As a school, we are obliged to inform you that you may be subject to a Penalty Notice if your child's absence from school is unauthorised and not categorised as an absence related to exceptional circumstances. This is in line with Staffordshire County Councils' Code of Conduct and the "Working Together to Improve School Attendance" statutory guidance (effective 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024). The penalties for unauthorised leave of absence in term time will be:

For a **First** offence the Penalty Notice fine would be:

- £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days, rising to
- £160 per parent, per child if paid between 21-28 days.

For a **Second** offence within 3-years of the first penalty notice being issued, the penalty notice fine would be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid between 28 days.

Following the second offence every new offence within the 3-year period, will be prosecuted under S444.1 of the Education Act 1996. I must advise you that if the prosecution takes place, the maximum fine is £1,000 per parent, per child. This reflects the seriousness of unauthorised absence from school.
