Important Reminder: Five Ways is a NUT-FREE School

Please be reminded that Five Ways

Primary School is a strictly <u>nut-free</u> environment. This policy is in place to protect several of our pupils who live with severe nut allergies, which can lead to life-threatening reactions, including anaphylaxis. To ensure the safety of all children, <u>NO</u> nut-based products are permitted on school grounds. This includes any food items that contain nuts or may contain traces of nuts. Allergic reactions can occur not only through eating but also through inhalation or skin contact, making vigilance essential. We kindly ask that you check all food labels carefully before packing your child's lunch or snacks. If a product states "may contain nuts" or "produced in a facility that handles nuts," please DO NOT send it into school.

Examples of items that must be avoided include: chocolate spreads (e.g. Nutella), cereal bars, biscuits and cakes containing nuts, certain sauces and condiments. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation in keeping our school community safe.
