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

World Book Day

Attendance

As it is now February, I am able to provide you with the attendance report for the month of January. The percentage attendance for the whole school for January was 96%, which falls just below our high expectation of 97%. Year 1 achieved the highest overall monthly attendance of 97% and Miss Heeley's class in Year 1, achieved an attendance of 98%, both of which are outstanding!
